PHASING UPDATE

Phase 6.1 (Central Square)

Phase 6.1 is fully built and occupied. Central Square has provided a Sainsbury's Local and a dentist, offering NHS and private dental work for the community. This phase also includes a youth club and community centre with office space above, which have seen great interest since opening last summer.

The community centre offers hire space for local businesses, social enterprises and start-ups. The youth club spans two-floors and provides an efficient use of space for a diverse range of projects. We're currently looking for suitable tenants for the café and flexible work unit.

Phase 6.2 (Hawthorn)

Construction works are progressing well at Phase 6.2. We held a 'topping out' ceremony to celebrate the last concrete being poured into the main structure which will complete the community hub, due for completion in autumn 2020. Hawthorn will provide space for retail outlets, a new nursery and a health centre.


This phase will provide a further 160 new homes, featuring a podium courtyard design.

Phase 7.1 (Boreal)

Phase 7.1 is made up of 246 new homes and is progressing well.
Habbington House and Tolkien House are now fully occupied.
Davenant Way and Rossetti Avenue are now complete, providing two improved streets. In Broadlands House and Betjeman House are now also fully occupied.

Refurbishment works to Avenue Park have been completed by Acton Gardens in December 2019. A full renovation is anticipated in late 2020. A public consultation, led by the London Borough of Ealing, was held in December 2019 and a further one is anticipated in early 2020.











Phase 9.1 (Lindley)

Located on the corner of Bollo Lane and Enfield Road, Phase 9.1 delivers 68 new homes. The new building is nearly complete, with the first core handed over in September 2019 with residents starting to move in. The hoarding line has been removed and the landscaping has progressed around the front of the building. The remaining works are on track to complete by the end of January 2020.

Phase 9.2 (Lindley)

Phase 9.2 secured planning permission in December 2018 for 203 new homes, set around a raised podium garden, together with a small new commercial unit at the ground floor overlooking West Park. Demolition of Buchan House, Anstey Court and properties on Osborne Road is now complete, and construction of the groundworks for the development has started.

Phase 9.4

Phase 9.4 was granted planning permission for 209 new homes in September 2019. Phase 9.4 is situated on the southern corner of Enfield Road and Bollo Lane. Demolition of the first properties to make way for this phase commenced in November 2019 and full construction is due to start in April 2020.

Phase 8.1 and 8.2

The next phase of Acton Gardens to come forward will be Phase 8.2 and 8.1. Phase 8.2 is proposed on the site of Barwick House, the South Acton Working Men's Club and Brouncker Road. The future Phase 8.1 is proposed on the site of Carisbrooke Court and Ludlow Court. A public exhibition was held in October 2019 at the Acton Gardens Community Centre to present the current designs for resident feedback. A planning application for this phase of development was submitted in December 2019. The application can be found on Ealing Council's planning portal with the reference number: 195428REM.

Community Board training

Design sub group meeting

The Community Board were invited to a design subgroup meeting for phase 8.1 and 8.2 along with L&Q, Ealing Council and Countryside on Monday 9th September. The meeting provided an opportunity for residents to look at detailed plans and speak to architects and other staff involved in the regeneration project about any queries and comments they had.

Open House London

On Saturday 21 September, Acton Gardens became a of hub of activity to celebrate Open House London, the world's largest architecture festival.

As part of the two-day festival which gives free public access to over 800 buildings, walks, and talks across the city, Acton Gardens hosted tours for nearly 50 visitors. Those that came along got to see inside existing homes at South Acton and new homes at Acton Gardens as well as experiencing some spectacular roof top views from Blackburn Court on Bollo Lane and Barwick House on Strafford Road.







Acton Gardens Phase 8.1 and 8.2 Public Exhibition

A public exhibition took place in October 2019 for phases 8.1 and 8.2 which are proposed to be built where Barwick House, Carisbrooke Court, Ludlow Court, the South Acton Working Men's Club and No.81 - No.95 Brouncker Road currently stand.

The afternoon and evening exhibition was well attended, and the team were so pleased to see so many residents and neighbours coming along to ask questions and provide feedback.

Acton Gardens Community Hub celebrates topping out

In September, a special ceremony was held at Acton Gardens to celebrate the topping out of phase 6.2 and the new community hub.

Led by Ealing Council Leader Julian Bell, representatives from Countryside, L&Q and Ealing Council oversaw the last concrete being poured into the main structure.

The Acton Gardens hub within phase 6.2, which is expected to open in autumn 2020, will contain a new doctor's surgery, a children's nursery and 160 new homes.

Acton Gardens Annual Construction Event

In October, Acton Gardens held their their 2nd annual construction event. The day was well attended with 60 students from West Thames College and Twyford High School attending a variety of workshops. The emphasis of the event was to encourage young people in education to seriously consider taking up a career in the construction industry.

Throughout the day students learnt about the various areas of the construction industry and got a chance to try out skills in a variety of practical trade workshops including plumbing, carpentry and brickwork. This was followed by two class- based workshops with architect and engineers and a site tour of phase 7.1.

Acton Gardens Community Centre

BOLLO LANE YOUTH CENTRE



It has been a busy few months at Bollo Brook Youth Centre, with a number of projects taking place. The work of the centre has been celebrated by the GLA at a photography exhibition about 'Inspiring Youth Work' at City Hall, with photos and words by local young people.

Artist Matt Small had a monthlong residency at the centre, working on an 8 foot high mural of Jamal Edwards MBE, a former attendee at the centre. The piece is made of recycled plastic and metal and eventually will be displayed in Acton.

As well as performing at the lighting of the Christmas tree outside the Acton Gardens Community Centre, young people from the youth centre hosted a showcase of their musical talent at the South Acton Social Club. Twenty young people performed original tracks in front of over 100 attendees, ranging from rap to garage and R'n'B, and with lyrics in Croatian and Lingala as well as English.
