



ACTON GARDENS COMMUNITY BOARD

The Acton Gardens Community Board (AGCB) is the formal resident involvement structure between the residents of Acton Gardens and South Acton and L&Q, Countryside and Ealing Council.

The Community Board oversees the regeneration of the South Acton by:

- · Providing feedback on the regeneration.
- Ensuring there is continued community involvement.
- Encouraging participation from groups currently under-represented.
- Allocating Community Chest funding for local projects.
- Attending quarterly Board meetings with I ocal stakeholders
- Attending tours, training, subgroups, and consultation events for feedback.
- Reviewing literature, communications and messages circulated to the community.

AGCB ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING REFLECTING ON 2023

This year's Community Board Annual General Meeting (AGM) took place on the 13th of February 2024 from 6pm till 8pm.

This was our first hybrid meeting of 2024, with participants attending in person at Acton Gardens Community Centre, as well as online via Microsoft Teams. 

PHASING UPDATE

This section of the South Acton Community Newsletter will provide you a construction update for the wider regeneration project. We have provided updates on works completed in 2023, phases where we are currently on site, and phases that we hope to get underway in 2024.

As you will see later in this update, the key action taking place on site in the next few months is the start of demolition on phase 9.3/5/6.

Phase 6.2

In spring and autumn of 2023 respectively, Mint Café and Energie Gym opened on the South Acton estate. These amenities are well-located at the centre of the estate providing a focal point for the community. Both the café and gym have enjoyed high levels of use since opening in 2023, and we hope that will continue to be the case through 2024 and beyond.

All blocks within phases 6.1 and 6.2 are now complete.

Phase 7.2

Phase 7.2 is located to the north of Avenue Road, with the completed Phase 7.1 to the east and Acton High Street to the north. Proposals are for 185 new homes, including Active Living homes for residents aged over 55, affordable rented homes, and private homes for sale.

This phase also contains the site wide energy centre. Demolition of the existing buildings (Cheltenham Place Block 6 and 8 and Frampton Court) were completed in 2023. Technical design for the phase continues to progress.

Phase 8.2

Phase 8.2 is made up of 6 separate blocks and 6 houses and forms the eastern boundary of Central Plaza. It contains 175 new homes and construction was completed in Spring 2023. The designated homes were handed over to L&Q over spring 2023 and occupied in summer 2023. Block B2 was bought by a Key Worker Impact fund which rents homes to Key Workers in London.

Phase 8.1

Phase 8.1 remains halted pursuant to securing vacant possession of Ludlow Court. Phase 8.1 will deliver a total of 161 new homes including a total of 51 affordable homes. We are targeting a start on site date of spring/ summer 2024, and the first task on site will be the demolition of Carisbrook Court.

Phase 9.2

Following negotiations, Budgens were secured as the new leaseholder of the commercial unit in December 2023. They are targeting an opening date in Spring 2024. Additionally, the final 2 residents moved into their new homes within phase 9.2 in 2023. This phase is now fully occupied.

Phase 9.4

Following completion of the construction of Phase 9.4, 35 residents moved into their new homes in 2023. This phase is now fully occupied

Phases 9.3, 9.5 and 9.6

Phase 9.3, 9.5 and 9.6 received unanimous planning consent on 15th December 2021. Located adjacent to the recently constructed Phase 9.2 and opposite West Park, Phases 9.3, 9.5 and 9.6 will complete the western quarter of Acton Gardens.

These phases will collectively deliver 215 homes, ranging from 1-bedroom apartments up to 4-bedroom houses. We are targeting a start on site date of 2024 for these phases. This phase presents a significant milestone for the regeneration project as it will contain the 1,000th affordable home built at Acton Gardens.

Works to the new allotments commenced in April 2023 and are now complete. Handover of the allotments is due to take place in the coming month. Vacant possession of Jerome Tower and Osbourne House was achieved in 2023. We are awaiting vacant possession at Dovle House.

We will commence demolition on this phase in March 2024. The demolition works will include the erection of hoarding, raising scaffolding to minimise dust, internal strip out of the existing buildings, followed by demolition of the buildings' structures.

Central Plaza

Acton South's Central Plaza was officially opened in the autumn of 2023 at which the main attraction was the recently completed art installation by London based artist Adébayo Bolaji. There have been some technical issues with the paints application, but these have now been resolved by the artist and we are hoping that the artwork will be re-uncovered in the next few weeks.

Central Plaza sits at the heart of Acton Gardens and aims to provide a new meeting point for the community, with places to sit, play and exercise, including a children's play area that frames Phase 8.2 and Phase 6.1.





























COMMUNITY CHEST



The Acton Gardens Community Chest has £50,000 available each year to fund local projects that support and benefit residents.

Applicants can apply for up to £5,000 funding to support delivery of their project. To date, we've funded over 100 projects, including health and wellbeing, art, environmental, educational support, community days, support groups and sports projects.

We're pleased to report that the Community Chest has provided over £500,000 to support local initiatives since it began, with the Descendants Drumming and Exploring Art Workshop last year marking the 150th project funded by the Community Chest. We're excited to be able to support even more great work across Acton Gardens.



The Descendants will also be celebrating their 30th Birthday Celebration on Saturday 25th of May 2024 @ Acton Gardens Community Centre, Bollo Bridge Road, W3 8UU, from 12-6pm.

Community Chest Spotlight!

Elisabeth Curlet, of Acton Litter Collective, recently wowed the Community Chest Sub-Group with her passion for the environment and community building through collective climate action. Below she tells the story of how Acton Litter Collective all began:

Some five years ago, South Acton resident, Elisabeth Curlet, decided that action, rather than words, was needed to achieve her ambition of a litter-free neighbourhood.



First steps... After liaising with Ealing Council to provide litter picks and green bags and reaching out to local residents, a small team of enthusiastic litter pickers began to meet once every fortnight at the Mill Hill Surgery on Avenue Road in September 2019. The group grew steadily, continuing (at distance) over lockdown and becoming a weekly meet up. Being able to say hello to friendly faces during that difficult period was a life saver for many. Founding member, Ann Brennan, named us the Acton Litter Collective and our first WhatsApp group was created.

Passers-by were inspired to join which led to territorial expansion! More ground was covered every week, new faces joined and the sense of care and wellbeing spread.

We learned about the useful "Love Clean Streets" app which enables us all to report fly tipping, potholes, graffiti, blocked gulleys, and more, so that the Council can address them.

In 2020, we heard about the Facebook Group LAGER Can (Litter Action Group of Ealing Residents), which had been set up a few years earlier by Keith Freegard with core belief is that community engagement positive impact environments - how right he was in terms of Acton! The organization is now run by volunteer Cathy Swift.

Fast forward to 2023... the old South Acton estate is steadily transforming into the delightful Acton Gardens development with new parks and play areas for all to enjoy. Landscape and green spaces have always been central to the redevelopment plans for Acton Gardens and, following years of hard work and investment, the Central Plaza was opened at the end of last year. Central Plaza sits at the heart of Acton Gardens and has already become a prominent meeting point for the community, with places to sit, play and exercise, including an exciting new children's play area.

Also, in May last year, Elisabeth met Acton Gardens resident Aga while litter picking in the area. In no time at all, a regular Sunday morning litter pick was established, and this new group developed at speed. Residents saw what was being achieved and sensed the spirit of co-operation which makes a strong community. There are now over 30 members, mostly joining through word of mouth, and Aga, a busy working Mum, impressively makes the time to post weekly on Facebook what the Acton Gardens LAGER Can group is achieving.

Everyone volunteering is provided with a litter pick, hoop and bags. We gather on Sundays, some meeting at 9.00am at the bike rack near the Mint Cafe or others around 10.30am to have a coffee. Several people also litter pick in their own time which is a tremendous help.



Please look out for your friendly litter pickers, say hello and consider joining our campaign to ensure that Acton is a really nice place to live - which it is!


Women's Boxercise Classes

Women's Boxercise Classes @ Acton Gardens Community Centre

Following a successful bid for Community Chest Funding, Acton Gardens Development Trust kicked off their Women's Boxercise Classes for all fitness levels on Wednesday 17th of January, which took place every Wednesday and Friday through to the 19th of April. The classes were run by none other than Hannah Beharry, a South Acton born and bred former 9x British Boxing Champion and 2x European Boxing Champion, who was also one of the first women to box for Great Britain.

The Boxercise classes aimed to not only provide a high-energy workout combining boxing techniques with cardio exercises but empower women in the Acton Gardens Community through providing a supportive environment. It's clear that the classes have been a total hit with local residents, with sign ups increasing week-on-week. Hannah has seen a massive growth in confidence and improvement in fitness from all participants, who are calling for the sessions to continue running.

UPDATE FROM YOUR LOCAL SAFER NEIGHBOURHOODS TEAM:

The Regeneration Team at Acton Gardens have been working closely with the Seargent Matthew Buckland from South Acton's Safer Neighbourhoods Team in recent months and we thought it would be great for him to write a segment introducing himself and the work his team are doing in your local area!

"I am the Safer Neighbourhood Team Sergeant for the South Acton ward, I work with four dedicated ward officers consisting of three police constables and one police community support officer.

The role of a safer neighbourhoods team is to focus on issues affecting the local community. We do this by listening to local residents and businesses through regular engagement, whether at pre-arranged events, conversations whilst on patrol or through social media.

Taking this information, we use a problem orientated policing approach, working with key stakeholders and partners to try and reduce the impact on the local population.

Once such issue is parcel theft, while online shopping is quick and easy, it cannot be ignored that parcels left in communal areas are vulnerable to theft.

In recent months, primarily on the run up to Christmas we focused both high visibility and plain clothed patrols in areas within the ward which had experienced high rates of this type of crime. As a result, the area target had no incidents of parcel theft reported in December.

We have discussed the issue with L&Q who are looking at ways of providing additional safe parcel drops sites and improving block security. We have also reached out to TfL to see if they are willing to have parcel lockers installed at nearby public transport stations.

We also wanted to provide some assurances following two assaults that took place linked to an event at the community centre. Both incidents are subject to ongoing criminal

investigations, however while two assaults did occur, there were no acid attacks, something which had caused concern within the local community.

In the following days we deployed officers from the South Acton ward team to patrol the area, supported by other Acton SNT colleagues.

In terms of future events, have discussed the situation with LDT, who have been proactive in taking steps to prevent similar occurring again. We have also offered support around their decision making when considering potential bookings. However, I want to state clearly this is the first incident of this kind linked to an event at the community centre, which remains a valuable resource for the local community.

We know that some residents have concerns regarding youth gathering and engaging in anti-social behaviour and drug use in the open space outside of the community centre, this is also something we continue to work on with local partners. We will endeavour to maintain a presence in the coming months as spring approaches.

Finally, we continue to offer free bike marking, further events will be advertised, however if you as a group of residents would like to arrange a visit to your bike storage area, the team would be happy to attend and mark as many bikes as possible. Bike marking cost upwards of £20 so this is a great opportunity to get your bike protected for free.

- Arranging for it to be left with a neighbour if nobody is home.
- Using an off-site locker service for frequent deliveries or expensive items.
- Installing a video doorbell and security light.

Free Yoga Classes






UPDATE - SOUTH ACTON CHILDRENS CENTRE

South Acton Children's Centre and Nursery School Children are Published Authors!

At South Acton Children's Centre and Nursery School we recently received a very exciting letter from Young Writers. It contained an invitation for our children to write their first poem. Eagerly, the older children from Oak and Chestnuts class completed their first poems during Family Learning, with the support of their parents and practitioners.

Once completed, the next step was to take them to the post-box and send them on their way.



During the next session of Family Learning, we printed a map so we could find our way to our nearest post-box. The children were so excited. We went with the families and followed the instructions on the map. We soon found the post-box, and one by one we posted our poems.

Then we waited for Young Writers to write back. It felt like such a long time! We felt impatient waiting to get a letter back!



But then one whole week later, we finally received another letter from them! This letter thanked all of us for participating. They sent every child a certificate and a bookmark to say well done!

Now, all the children's poems will be published in a book, and we will be gifted a copy to keep at the nursery to share with the children. Our families will also have the opportunity to buy a copy of the book, to keep their children's first ever published piece of work.

We are so excited to see the final results and so proud of our young authors!

EARTH DAY 2024 PLANET VS PLASTICS

Earth Day takes place every year on the 22nd of April to demonstrate support for environmental protection.



The first official 'Earth Day' took place in 1970, and it has now expanded to include a wide range of events across the globe coordinated by Earthday.org, including 1 billion people in more than 193 countries.

The theme for Earth Day 2024 is Planet vs Plastic, in line with Earthday.org calling for a 60% reduction in the production of plastics by 2024, with the overarching goal of building a plastic-free future for future generations.

We want to encourage residents across Acton Gardens to champion the ambitions Planet vs Plastic this Earth Day by doing whatever you can to reduce your plastic consumption! Be it making sure you carry a reusable bag with you, joining your local litter collective, or educating yourself on recycling and single-use plastic - there are plenty of simple ways to make an impact!
